STIPULATION RE CHILD SUPPORT
AND TEMPORARY SPOUSAL
SUPPORT

17 The parties, KOSTIANTYN MARS, by and through his attorney of record, Ryan
18 Romero/Steven Dinneen and HANNA MARS, by and through her attorney of record, Nancy L.
19 Roberts, hereby agree and stipulate as follows:

20 **CHILD SUPPORT**

21 1. **Child Support Payments.** Commencing February 1, 2023, Petitioner agrees to pay
22 Respondent for the support, care, maintenance, and education of the minor child of the Parties,
23 Maksym Mars (11/23/2015), as follows:

24 Amount of support per month: One Thousand Six Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,650)

25 First payment to be made on February 1, 2021.

26 Payments to be made: Semi-monthly

27 Subsequent payments of \$ 825.00 each shall be paid on the first day and the fifteenth day of each
28 month. Petitioner shall pay to Respondent, as additional child support, an amount calculated by

1 using the two-way schedule(s) set forth in Exhibit B of Petitioner's income above Thirteen
2 Thousand Three Hundred Thirty-Three Dollars (\$13,333) each month. "Petitioner's income"
3 shall include bonuses, capital gains income, tax free income, income available from matured
4 stock options, whether or not exercised, etc. Said bonus support shall be payable by Petitioner
5 within 15 days of receipt of said bonus money by Petitioner.

6 **3. Child Support Termination and Reductions.** The payments specified in Section 2 cease to
7 be due for the child on the first to occur of the following events: Child dies, Respondent dies and
8 Petitioner assumes custody, the child is emancipated, or the child reaches the age of 18 (except
9 that an unemancipated 18-year-old unmarried child, who is a full-time high school student and is
10 not self-supporting, shall be entitled to continued support until the completion of the 12th grade
11 or attaining the age of 19, whichever first occurs).

12 **4. Additions to Child Support.** In addition to the child support set forth above, the following
13 amounts shall be paid (as provided below) to Respondent as part of the regular monthly allotment
14 of child support from Petitioner:

15 (A) Child Care Costs Related to Employment/Training. Each of the Parties will pay one
16 half of the cost of child's child care related to employment, education and/or training for
17 employment. The Court shall reserve jurisdiction to resolve disputes between the Parties
18 related to this provision.

19 (B) Unreimbursed Health-Care Expenses. Each of the Parties will pay one half of the
20 cost of all of the child's health care expenses that aren't reimbursed by health insurers. Neither
21 party will unreasonably withhold consent to a health-care expense recommended by a licensed
22 physician. The Court shall reserve jurisdiction to resolve disputes between the Parties related to
23 this provision.

24 **5. Procedures for Reimbursement of Add-On Expenses.** The additional child support
25 expenses enumerated in Section 4 above shall be handled by the Parties per the attached Notice
26 of Rights and Responsibilities.

27 **6. Attachment of Support Assumptions.** As required by law, attached hereto as Exhibit A is
28 the parties' proposed DissoMaster (TM) support calculation setting forth their assumptions with
regard to gross income, tax filing status, time-share, add-on expenses, and any other factor
relevant to the support calculation. Attached hereto as Exhibit B is the parties's proposed

1 DissoMaster (TM) support calculation setting forth their assumptions with regard to bonus
2 income of both parties.

3 7. Child Support Declaration. The Parties acknowledge, pursuant to Fam. Code §4065, that:
4 (i) they are fully informed of their rights concerning child support; (ii) they have agreed to the
5 child support provisions of this Agreement without coercion or duress; (iii) this Agreement is in
6 the best interests of the child involved; (iv) the needs of the child will be adequately met by this
7 agreed-upon child support; and (v) they have not assigned the right to support to the county and
8 no public assistance application is pending.

9 TEMPORARY SPOUSAL SUPPORT

10 7. Temporary Spousal Support Payments. Commencing February 1, 2023, Respondent shall
11 pay Petitioner for her support and maintenance One Thousand Nine Hundred Eighty-One Dollars
12 (\$1,974) each month. Payments are to be made semi-monthly on the first and fifteenth day of
13 each month in the amount of Nine Hundred Eighty-Seven Dollars (\$987).

14 8. Additional Temporary Spousal Support Payments. Petitioner shall pay to Respondent, as
15 additional spousal support, an amount calculated by using the two-way schedules set forth in
16 Exhibit B of Respondent's earned income above Thirteen Thousand Three Hundred and Thirty-
17 Three Dollars (\$13,333) each month. Said bonus/additional income support shall be payable by
18 Respondent within 10 days of the parties calculation of any additional monthly income in excess
19 of \$19,997 calculated monthly and shall be accompanied by a copy of the relevant pay stubs as
20 well as the calculation of the bonus support.

21 9. Any and all prior court orders not in conflict with this order remain in full force and effect.

22 10. This agreement may be executed in counterpart. Electronic signatures shall be deemed
